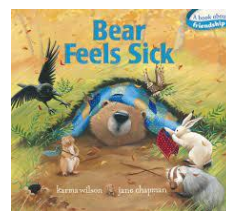
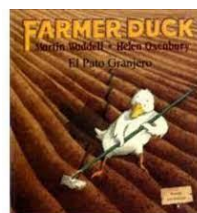
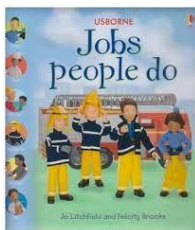
Our topic question this half-term is

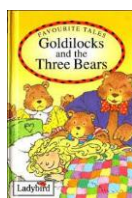
